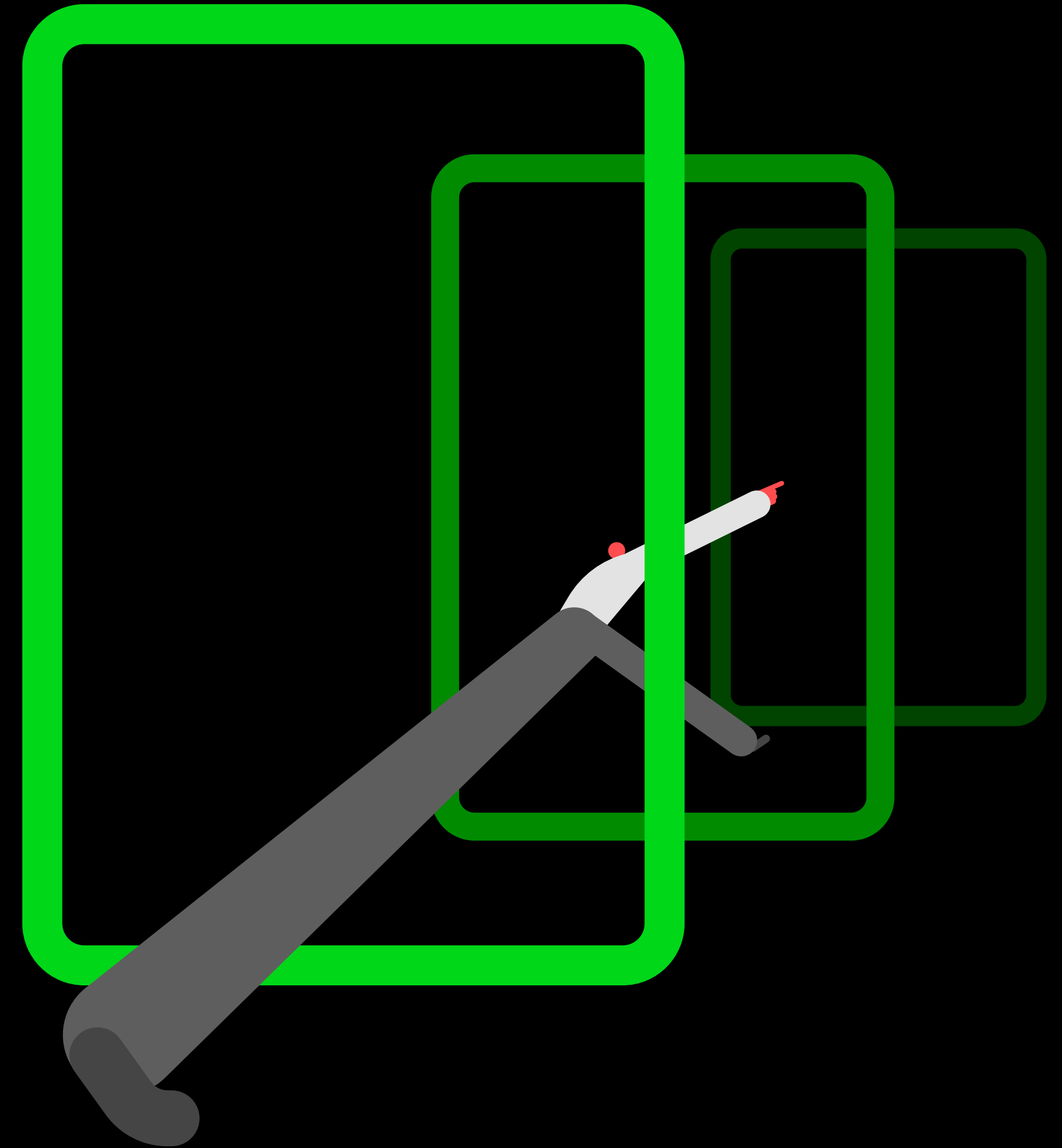
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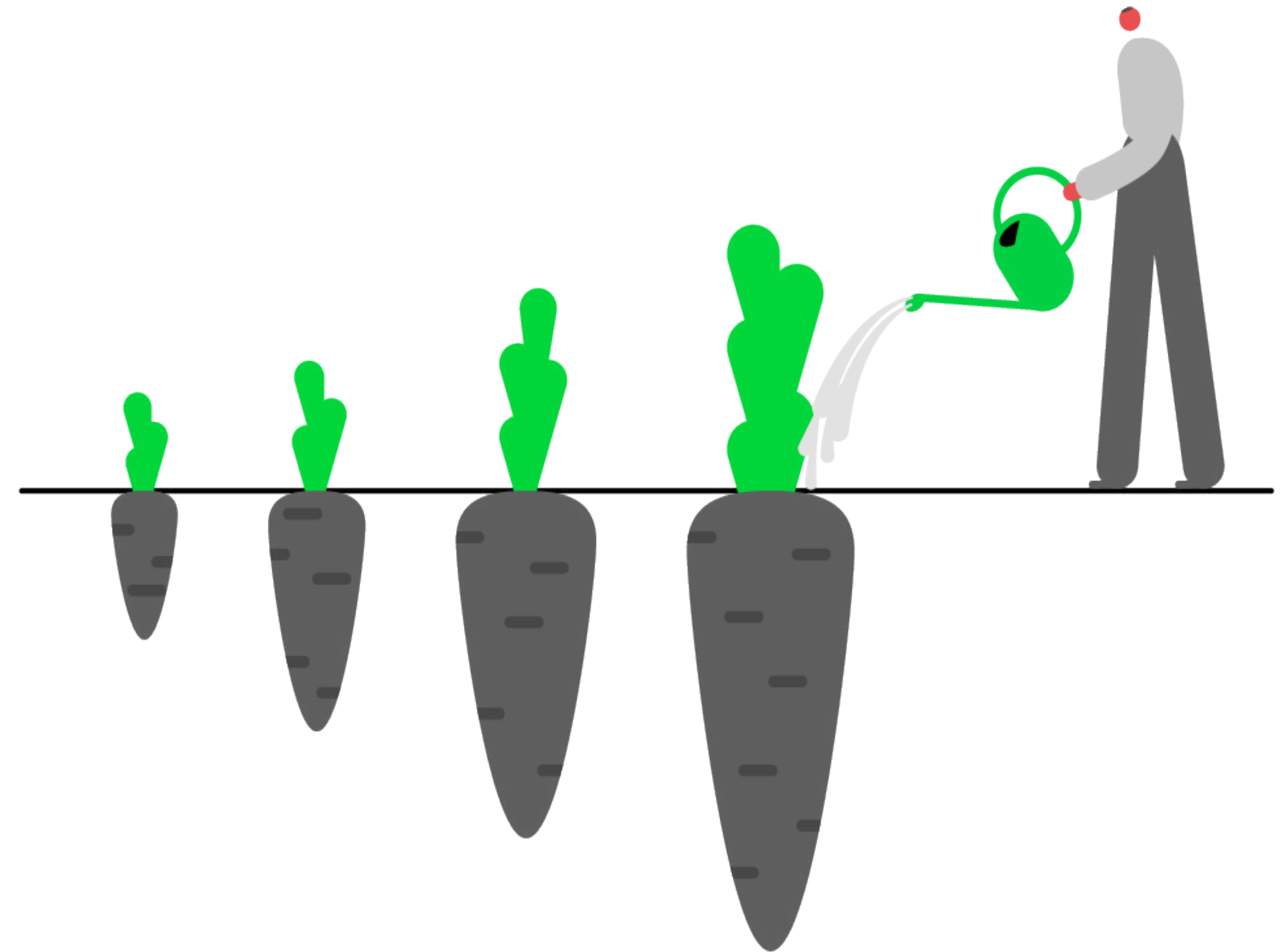
Growing beyond the capabilities of spreadsheet planning

Sign 1

“I just pulled an all-nighter again to prep for the board meeting.”

Managing budgets in Excel requires a lot of tactical work.

Downloading CSV files, cutting and pasting, rolling up data, emailing files, building and updating forecasts and models, and updating formulas and links. If you're consumed with these tasks, or worse, having to spend your nights and weekends managing plans and budgets, an easy-to-use budgeting and planning solution can streamline the process and help you get your life back!



Sign 2

“Joe is the only one who understands the model!”

When you’ve got complex forecasting and what-if models and only one person in your organization knows how it works, you are exposing your organization to risk if that person moves on.

What are the cost and ramifications to having someone new diagnose, understand, and update the models if he leaves? You can ensure your continuity with a budgeting and planning solution that enables you to define models that consistently operate on the data you pull in from your plans, budgets, and actuals.

“Oops, sorry, that’s a formula error.”

We’ve all been there. You thought you double-checked everything, but you got that last-minute change and forgot to update the link in your formula before the presentation to management or (yikes!) the board.

Your constituents and stakeholders depend on you to get the numbers right, and errors reduce their confidence and could lead to misguided decisions if not caught. With a budgeting and planning solution, you can easily calculate metrics such as cash flow or model headcount expenses—without spreadsheet errors.

“Oh no! Did I just send the one with the salary info?”

Budgets usually include sensitive data such as salary information. Because of this, you will need the ability to limit access to specific budgets and budget information.

Storing or sending unprotected budget files around via email or on shared drives risks access by unauthorized people. A true budgeting and planning solution enables you to secure plans, budgets, and sensitive information with internal controls that protect you from the risks of inappropriate access.

“Wait, that’s not the version I’ve been managing to.”

Changes are often made to budgets throughout the year to realign to changing priorities and conditions.

Version control issues can have significant consequences beyond just confusion. That means that key parts of the organization can be operating from the wrong information, making decisions and spending money in ways that aren’t aligned to your nonprofit’s goals.

A budgeting and planning solution provides one source of truth for everyone. You know who updated the budget and when. Everyone is bought in and aligned to the same plans, budgets, and forecasts.

“When did you send it out? I can’t find the email.”

Using Excel and email to send out spreadsheets means maintaining distribution lists and digging through email to find budgets.

It makes you the go-to person for even the smallest things because department heads don’t trust that they have the right data, can’t find what they need, or need you to make an update.

With a budgeting and planning solution, everyone has one place to go to find their data. You can easily invite department heads to enter and update their own plans, budgets, forecasts, and scenarios. You are no longer the bottleneck for everything budget-related.

In the meantime, everyone is waiting on their reports to see what the actuals were from the last period, potentially delaying operational and strategic decisions. 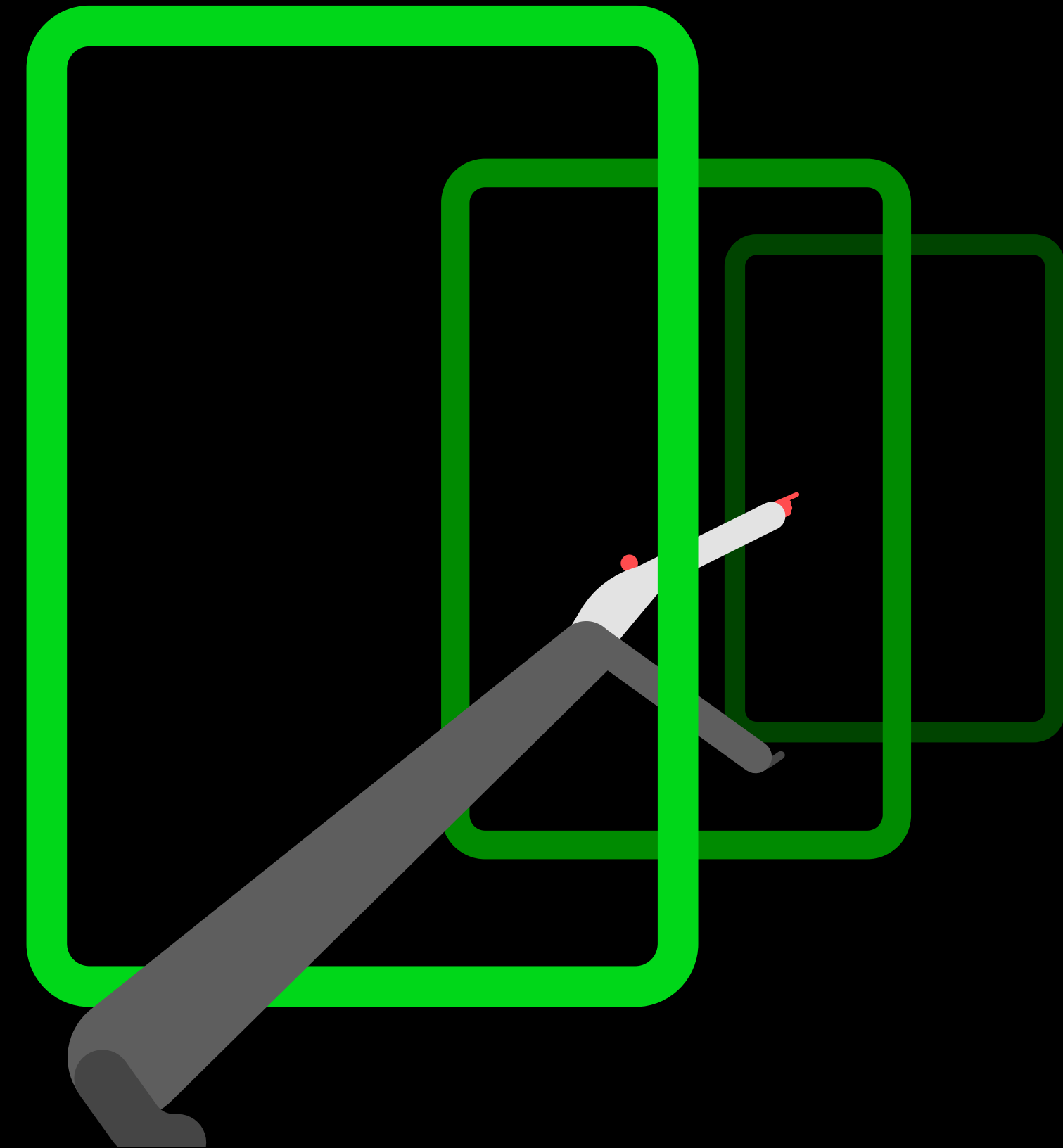

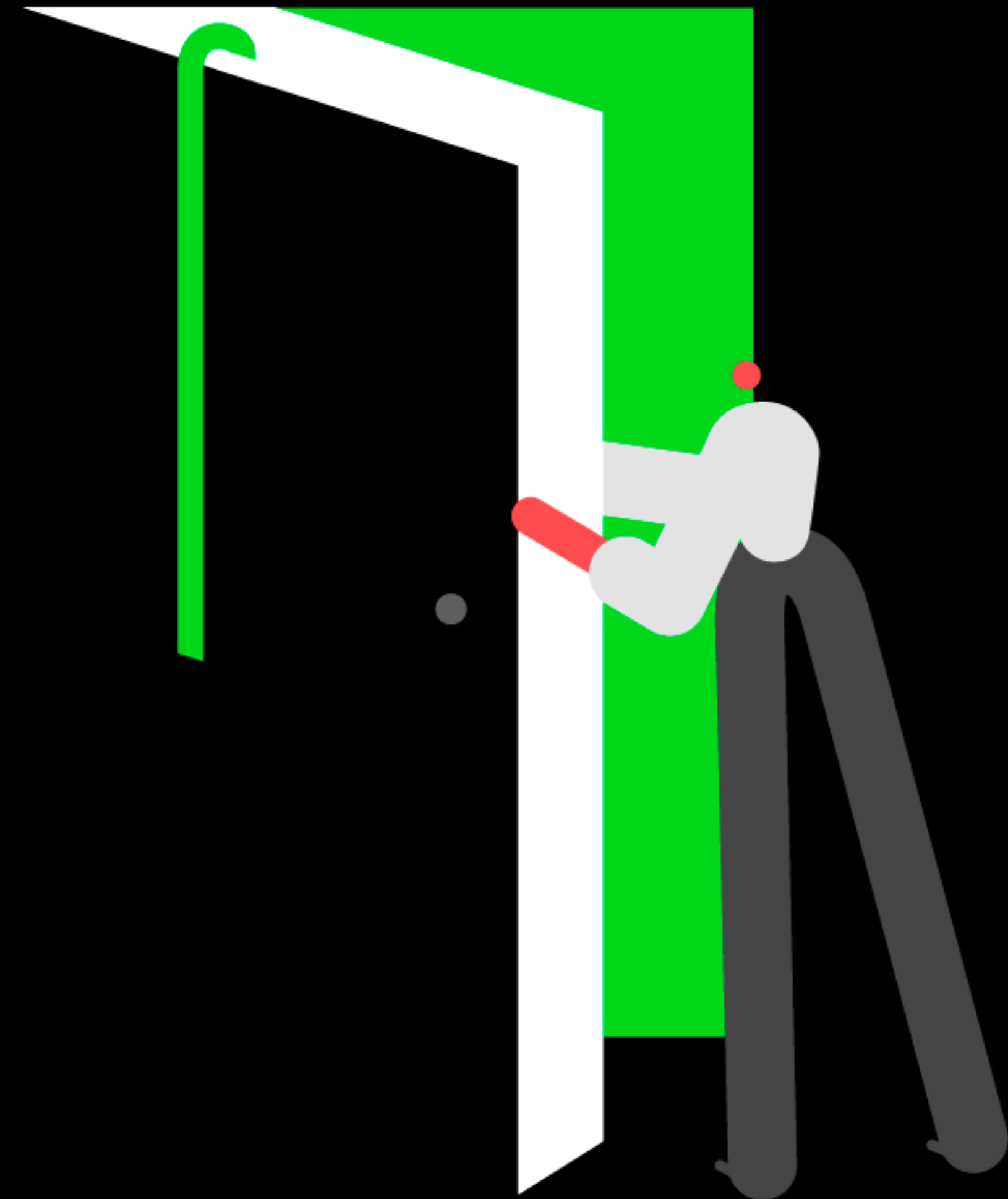
